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1.0 Purpose

This request for information (RFI) is an information gathering process in which Blacksburg Transit (BT) seeks to collect information and opinions from integrators of transit technology and original equipment manufacturers (OEMs). This request for information and the responses provided may be used to assist BT in the preparation of a future scope of work and RFP document for designing and implementing demand response/paratransit scheduling and dispatching software and service delivery alternatives. 2.0 Background

Blacksburg Transit (BT) is an independent government entity located in Blacksburg, Va. BT provides public transportation services in and around Blacksburg and Christiansburg, Va with 18 fixed routes and demand response/paratransit services. BT has 2 types of demand response services: an ADA service in Blacksburg and a curb to curb public transportation service in Christiansburg. The current bus fleet is made up of 53 fixed-route coaches and 19 paratransit BOCs. BT currently uses RouteMatch as the scheduling and dispatching software and everything is hosted on servers that are on site. The vehicles have TripSpark Rangers already installed on them, but BT is open to options that do not utilize the Ranger. BT's demand-response services had 28,453 unlinked passenger trips in fiscal year 2019. In the coming years, BT plans to expand demand-response services, and the expected increase in trips annually is about 10,000. With this planned service expansion, BT is seeking more information on the current state of the software market and exploring alternative service delivery options.
